



DOMESTIC STUDENTS STUDYING OVERSEAS

APPLYING FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDY

Regardless of previous country of study or qualification, Australian citizens, Australian permanent residents and New Zealand citizens are considered 'domestic' students for the purposes of admission to the University of Melbourne. Domestic students apply for Commonwealth Supported Places (CSPs) in undergraduate courses at the University of Melbourne, by submitting a course application through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC).

WHEN TO APPLY

Timely applications for the start year/Semester 1 (March) intake - for all undergraduate courses - close at the end of September in the preceding year. Note: Bachelor of Fine Arts (all specialisations) and Bachelor of Music require applicants to complete supplementary application steps. While our other courses remain open to 'late' (and even 'very late') applications via VTAC, it is not possible to apply late for Fine Arts or Music.

Many of our undergraduate courses also offer a mid-year/Semester 2 (July) intake. Applications for mid-year entry close in early June.

After your studies have been completed, you should submit your final results to VTAC to support your course application, as per the instructions on the VTAC website at:

vtac.edu.au/applying/documentation

When applying through VTAC, course codes that end in '1' reflect a CSP.

WHAT IT WILL COST

As a domestic undergraduate student, you will enrol in a CSP, which is subsidised by the Australian Government.

You pay a student contribution, with the amount determined each year by the Australian Government, based on the subjects in which you enrol. The exact cost of your student contribution depends on the subjects you take, not the course you are studying.

2023 UNDERGRADUATE ENTRY

WHEN ARE OFFERS MADE?

VTAC's 'January offer round domestic' occurs in mid-January, for students commencing in Semester 1.

For students commencing in Semester 2, offers are released in July each year.

To accept your place, you must follow the instructions provided in the University's offer information which will be emailed to all successful applicants.

WHEN CAN I START?

Semester 1, 2023

commences on 27 February 2023

Semester 2, 2023

commences on 24 July 2023

Students should attend orientation activities during the weeks prior to semester start dates.

WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

Applications for CSPs are generally considered on the basis of academic merit, the number of places available and demand for the course. All applicants must satisfy course prerequisites. Applicants may also be eligible for consideration under our Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) - Access Melbourne.

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma, GCE A Levels, and many other qualifications from around the world are considered for admission to the University. The minimum entry requirements for domestic students are equivalent to the entry standards for international students. However, CSPs are offered on the basis of academic merit, so the actual standard required to receive an offer may be higher than the minimum admission requirement, depending on the demand for the course and the number of CSPs available.

UNIQUE STUDENT IDENTIFIER (USI)

All domestic students who enrol in a new course at the University require a USI (a government-issued reference code). You will require a USI to finalise your CSP enrolment, so it's best to plan ahead. For more information, see the USI website:
